



Bath & West Country Festival – FAQs

When is the Bath & West Country Festival?

27th – 29th August 2021

Can I camp at the Festival?

Camping is available to purchase on our website (bathandwest.com/tickets).

Pitches are £15 per night for a Grass, Non-Electric Pitch.

You will also need to purchase a ticket to gain access to the Festival

How much are tickets for the Festival?

Saver Ticket (Ends 15 Aug)

£15 – Adult (inc. 2 free children)

£4 – Additional Child

Advance Ticket (Starts 16 Aug)

£18 – Adult (inc. 2 free children)

£6 – Additional Child

Gate Ticket (Starts 27 Aug)

£20 – Adult

£6 – Additional Child

£15 – Senior Ticket

Can I purchase tickets on the day?

Currently, we are limiting the number of tickets available per day, so it is preferred that you book in advance to avoid disappointment. We are also awaiting further advice from the Government as to whether we can sell tickets on the gate.

Can I use my Royal Bath & West Show tickets for the Bath & West Country Festival?

Yes, all tickets are automatically valid for the Bath & West Country Festival. You are not required to select which day you will be attending, so you can join us for any one day of the festival.

I paid more for my Royal Bath & West Show Ticket – will you refund me the difference?

If you purchased an Advance Saver Ticket, a £5 OFF Voucher will be emailed to you later this year, so you can get £5 off your ticket for the Royal Bath & West Show 2022.

What is your disabled ticketing policy for 2021?

What is the Bath & West doing to keep everyone COVID safe?

We are closely following the Government Guidance to ensure the safety of all visitors. We have reduced the number of marquees and will be using all of our permanent buildings which are spacious and have plenty of air flow.

We are currently limiting the number of tickets available per day. As we get closer to the Festival, we will review this, in the hope that we can release more tickets. Ticket insurance is also available to add to your ticket booking, which will cover you & your family should you be unable to attend due to COVID19.

There will also be plenty of hand washing / sanitising stations across the Showground.

What is the difference between the Royal Bath & West Show and the Bath & West Country Festival?

Whilst the Bath & West Country Festival will still have many features that you know & love from the Royal Bath & West Show (including Main Ring, Main Lawn, Woodland & Countryside Arena), we will also be introducing some NEW features (for example, Lakeside Farm, Canine Corner). The Food Hall will take on a NEW location (the Showering Pavilion), allowing you to shop for delicious local produce. Roaming performers, fun photo opportunities, scrumptious street food and live music will give you all the fun festival feelings too! Unfortunately, we will not be hosting any competitive classes for Livestock & Equine (although we will be retaining some competitive Equine Classes, including Show Jumping & Heavy Horses).
