The hugely popular Pilton Tent will make a welcome return, as will the Woodland & Countryside Arena. The Arena welcomes back Great British Dogs, the Dorset Axemen and Hawkeye Falconry, amongst many other exciting attractions. Energetic members of your family can try their hand at activities in the enhanced Sports Village, which has support from Bath Rugby Foundation and Shepton Mallet Football Club; whilst the youngest members can enjoy Bubble Inc and Tractor Ted.

Cheese lovers should head to the Cheese Marquee, a new feature for 2023, located on Avenue B opposite the Main Ring. This will showcase the best of the cheese world in the surrounding area as well as delicious cheese accompaniments, and you'll find vendors including Barbers, Bath Soft Cheese and Stockans.

The green-fingered members of the family should also be sure to visit the new and improved Horticulture Village. There, they can enjoy the Chelsea Garden exhibit by The Newt in Somerset, a garden specifically designed for the show by Yeo Valley Organic, and new trade stands promoting horticultural products and garden furniture to enhance outdoor rooms.
